If only all cats could be like the one in our picture! Examining a cat's mouth is not always that easy, as generally our independent feline friends do not like to

be messed with. They will accept all the fussing, pampering and scrumptious treats their owners bestow upon them, but when it comes to giving pills or dental checks, those jaws are firmly shut tight! Unfortunately when cooperation is not forthcoming, the start of major problems can be overlooked, and it is only when they show signs of discomfort or are reluctant to eat that you realise trouble is brewing.

Some felines are more prone to suffering from inflammatory mouth diseases, which if not treated can cause serious complications. Inflamed swollen gums (gingivitis), ulcers or cuts on the tongue and roof of the mouth, can be an extremely painful experience for your cat.

Signs to watch out for are

❖ Excessive drooling ❖ Bleeding gums ❖ Irritable or depressed

❖ Difficulty or reluctance to eat ❖ Bad breath ❖ Trouble grooming

If you notice any of the above or suspect something is not quite right, please bring your cat in for a check-up. If we should find a problem, and once the vet has assessed the type of oral disease, we can discuss the different forms of treatment available here at our surgery.

In fact it's not just our feline friends that can suffer from this problem, as dogs may also develop mouth problems too! Dental disease is one of the most common problems we see in practice, and can affect your pet's health and well-being. Everyday plaque builds up on their teeth from food and bacteria, which eventually develops into tartar and starts to cause gum disease, resulting in discomfort and pain. The gum infection can also potentially cause kidney and heart

problems. However, trying to persuade your

dog or cat to brush their teeth everyday is not easy! Our nurses can give your pet a free dental check and advice on how to manage their oral hygiene. They will even show you how to examine you pet's mouth with confidence!

Time to Wake Up

With the mild winter this year, we have seen a number of tortoises not eating after waking up from their hibernation. As the weather becomes warmer they will start to arise. This is when your pet should be given daily baths for the first week, and slowly encouraged to eat. If your tortoise is struggling to wake up or has not begun eating within a few weeks of rousing from their winter sleep, they may have an illness, which often needs supportive feeding via a tube placed into their stomach to help them. If you are concerned about the 'waking up progress' of your tortoise, then please book an appointment for our vet to give them check-up.

Looking ahead to Winter 2014 Most UK tortoises will hibernate for a few months during the cold season. Prior to this, they should be healthy and the correct weight. So forward plan, and as winter approaches bring them along for a pre-hibernation check, to help your tortoise snuggle down for their long sleep.

There's still time...... to book your pet a ticket to accompany you on your holidays abroad this year. It's quite a simple process to obtain a PETS Passport for your four-legged friend, which will allow them to travel easily between the qualifying countries. To gain successful re-entry to the UK from EU and listed non-EU countries, the regulations just need to be completed in this exact order.

- 1. Microchip your pet.
- 2. Vaccinate against rabies and wait 21 days.
- 3. Obtain from us a documented EU PETS Passport.
- 4. Before returning to the UK, ensure that your pet is treated for tapeworm by a vet, not less than 24 hours, and not more than

scheduled arrival in the UK.

If you are embarking on a short trip, number 4 can actually be completed with us before you go.

Stay

It has been known for the UK to have long hot summers, but no matter what the season is here, it is notoriously unpredictable! This is why, as pet owners we must be aware that a cool summer day, can suddenly turn into a bit of a scorcher.

Heatstroke (hyperthermia) a rise in body temperature, can affect our pets, even when the sun is not shining. Warm, cloudy and humid weather, can cause the heat to rise in cars, conservatories, your home and in the garden. If the sun does show its face, such places become even hotter, and as an animal's cooling system is not as efficient as ours, your pet can very quickly become overheated and dehydrated. If their temperature reaches a high level, damage can occur to organs and the cell system.

Prevent It

Never leave your pet in the car, not even with the windows open. They will cook in minutes! Provide plenty of fresh, cool, clean drinking water.

Take the daily walks in the **cooler** early morning or late evening air, and don't allow over exertion.

Ensure access to shady cooler areas in and outdoors.

Most pets enjoy a good snooze in the sun, but please encourage the forty winks in the shade.

Place rabbit and guinea pigs' housing, outside run and water in the shade. Ensure the hutch has good ventilation.

Recognise the Signs

Increased panting 🜼 Disorientation Anxious Pacing Distress Reluctant or unable to rise Dark gums Excessive or thick saliva Collapse F Loss of consciousness

The Key Pets can recover from heatstroke, but early recognition and prompt action is essential.

If at any time you think your pet is suffering from this condition, immediately move them to a cool area, and call your vet.
